## FROM THE DIRECTOR/EDITOR, PAUL R. ROUSSEL

CAM OFFICE ACTIVITIES: Mike, Jack and I have been very busy with visits from ex-offenders and their families requesting help. We have met some of their physical needs such as: clothing, shoes, work boots, rent money and bicycles. We also try to meet their spiritual needs by sharing the Gospel and that the Lord is the only one who can transform their lives by turning them from darkness to light and set them free. We received a call and subsequent visit from a mother and an aunt of an inmate who has been in and out of prison because of drug abuse. We shared how Jesus died on the cross for all of us and how all three of them could have hope again by putting their faith in Christ. When I visited Steve in prison, he accepted Jesus as his Lord and Savior.

BIBLE STUDIES: There are several ongoing Bible studies held in the CAM office each week during the day and on Monday evenings. Guy Torgensen, a Christian businessman, leads a Bible study with men from Helping Hands who wish to attend. We thank the Lord for Guy's faithfulness in service to the Lord and to these men and for the special way he interacts with each one.

VALLEY STREET JAIL PRAISES: Pastor/Chaplain David Carlson led the Easter service with 110 men and women attending. Sixteen accepted the Lord as their Savior. Praise also for answered prayer for a Christian mother who traveled from down South to visit her son in prison. Her prayer was answered and she was able to spend time with her son and encourage him. Praise for Justin who accepted Christ as his Savior, and also received a release date from prison. An overall praise for the good working relationship we have with the administration at Valley Street Jail as we minister there.

I have been blessed as I see the men grow as Christians as they seek to know more about Jesus. A recent study was, "What or Who Do We Value?" It is usually revealed in the things we think or talk about the most. Do we value people over things?

In Exodus, God is showing how testing reveals how committed we really are to Him. Pain sows the depth of our commitment. Absolute dependence on God makes our partnership with God work. In 2010, still in prison, I received news that my son John, who was a Christian, had died. A Christian volunteer at the prison asked me if I ever wanted to see my son again. I needed to accept Jesus as my Savior and that day, I did.

From that point on, everything got better as the Lord blessed my life. I was released from prison May 26, 2013. I now attend the Gospel Baptist church and help Pastor Carlson. I am also involved in helping CAM with their clothing and furniture ministry.
