FROM THE DIRECTOR By Paul Roussel

Our 14th annual CAM dinner. Sept. 20, was the best ever. Lennie Spitale was the speaker, Joey O'Brien shared his testimony. Pastor Clouse from Merrimack Valley Baptist Church shared some thoughts on "What CAM means to Our Church," and promised a one time donation (\$5,000) to start the Christian transitional housing program. On the basis of that donation, and generous donations at the dinner, we are moving ahead. Helping Hands has the rooms available, and Joey O'Brien agreed to be the house parent. We have the required insurance coverage. We are considering two possible candidates as our first clients. We are very excited about moving forward as the Lord leads.

The Lord continues to bless Valley Street Jail with Pastor Dave Carlson as chaplain. I do visits every Monday morning. Just recently, Michael and Henry accepted Jesus as Savior. Mike Grady does at least one Bible study per week, and other pastors and volunteers conduct Bible studies throughout the jail.

On October 3rd I visited 12 men at the Berlin, NH prison with Chaplain Dana Hoyt sitting in. Our visits serve many purposes: 1) to meet each man who has written to me, and to share God's plan of salvation and pray with him. 2) to encourage each one and let them know the Lord loves them, and3) to see how our ministry can help them when they are released from prison.

In the last three months, we have ministered to approximately 80 men and women, with most all needing clothes.

On Sunday September 9, I had the opportunity to speak at the New Beginnings Church of the Nazarene about our ministry and showed the CAM video.

OPEN DOORS By Jack Shuler New CAM Volunteer

"Teach me to do Your will, for You are my God" Psalm 143:10a

Over forty years ago, I was a young Army Captain, about to finish my military duty. After my stint as Acting Commander of the Armed Forces Examining and Entrance Station in Manchester, my wife, two young children and I, were about to head to Dental School at Baylor in Dallas, TX. Shortly before we left, I picked up the Union Leader and read a report of an armed robbery in the area. Little did I know that the man who committed that crime would later become a follower of Jesus Christ and begin Christian Aftercare Ministries.

After graduation I returned to Londonderry, NH. I had occasion to get to personally know this man, Lennie Spitale, and saw him "now and again" during the 32 years of my dental practice. In 1984, I committed my life to Jesus Christ, and asked Him to show me His will in the area of my Christian service. In that same year, God opened the door to short-term medical/dental missions, and my wife and I have been able to serve on 37 trips to 12 countries.

It was on the first trip to Villahermosa, Mexico that I was struck with the fact that in God's EYES the immortal SOUL of (continued next page)

of each and every person, no matter how poor, dirty, pitiful, or downtrodden, was equal in value to MY OWN. The Bible clearly states that Christ showed great love and healing, especially for the poorest; those excluded from society, for the children, the widow, the leper, and the prostitute, and, yes, the prisoner. He let these people know they were precious to God. **In fact, one of His last acts at His crucifixion was to redeem a condemned prisoner!**

During my dental practice years, I had many young people ask me, "How can I know God's will for my life when it comes to service?" My answer was simply this: "Pray and ASK HIM, then IF HE opens doors, go through them. If not, DON'T try to kick them down! He may have something else for you."

After my retirement from practice, the Lord continued to allow these short-term mission trips, however, I wanted to be available to Him now that I had more free time. My wife and I became members of the Merrimack Valley Baptist Church. During the VERY FIRST event we attended. I met Paul Roussel. He told me about CAM. Although we had been supporting the ministry in a small financial way, and I knew of two others in my circle of friends who served the Lord with CAM, I was not all that familiar with its mission and purpose. Paul invited me to Lowell Street in Manchester for a visit. It hit me that the Lord just might be opening another door. Now it was time for the "rubber to meet the road." Would I be willing to take my own advice?

Sure enough, the door opened. Through CAM, I have the privilege of coming alongside needy people – many of whom have spun down to life's lowest depth. My Lord has the answer! Only HE can truly change a life. After all, He changed MINE! (cont'd)

As Paul and Mike Grady have mentored me, I have become even more certain of Christ's power to change lives (I Cor. 2:12). He can prevent bad choices, bind up wounds, and reunite broken families. THE LORD'S WORK INSIDE THE WALLS

Many of you have heard the comment that it is far easier to be a Christian inside prison walls than it is after you are released

The concept of aftercare is to provide help, encouragement, and guidance when a person is released, but the Christian journey starts well before release.

The key to a successful Christian re-entry starts inside the walls, with individuals making a 100% heart-changing commitment to walk with Jesus. That requires the individuals, after having been convicted by the Holy Spirit of their need to change, confess their sins and accept Jesus as Savior, to be overwhelmed by the Lord's wonderful mercy in transforming their lives. As they start to praise the Lord for blessing their lives, the journey to becoming a committed Christian starts. Their faith grows, they start reading the Bible, and they want to please Jesus. They quickly realize the importance of Christian fellowship provided by Bible studies, chapel services, Christian recovery programs and prayer time. How faithful they are in attending these opportunities for growth is a measure of their commitment to Jesus.

In New Hampshire, the Lord has provided doors open to the Gospel in all the jails and prisons in the state. Hundreds of Christian volunteers who go in and do Bible studies, lead Christian programs like Alpha, and do weekend seminars (Prison Fellowship and Kairos). In addition to all this, the Christian inmates do their own Bible studies in the pods and in the process, hold one another accountable for their walk.

As a ministry, our ongoing prayer is that the Lord will use ALL the Christians (inmates and volunteers) to share Jesus with every person incarcerated in New Hampshire.
