We sometimes grow more than those we minister to. Over the past months I have seen these men grow through the Bible studies they attend although they, as we all do, still struggle with the old self. Slowly the men changed and began a new walk with God. Watching and being a part of that change is the greatest privilege of my Christian walk.


One man whom I've known for years was on the unit for several weeks and finally came to Bible study. When asked what took so long, he stated that God could no longer use him because he ruined his testimony. He was once very active in his church – even leading Bible studies at the jail. MY PERSONAL TESTIMONY BY JOHN KUNZE

I GREW UP IN Keene, NH in a strict Christian family with parents who loved each other. Growing up I felt like the black sheep of the family, and a neglected child. We attended church every week, but the church had strict rules that I struggled with. Part of my issues growing up was addiction to pornography and leading a double life trying to please everyone.

I strayed away from the Lord in my teenage years and was involved in unhealthy, sinful, behavior. After graduation from high school, I went to one year of college.

I was arrested and sent to prison and while there, I cried out to the Lord for help. In reaching out to the Lord, I could feel His hand of blessing and protection. **Within a year in prison, I re-committed my life to Jesus.** The Lord surrounded me with friends behind the walls. Halfway through my sentence I applied for a sentence reduction which was approved by the judge. I again felt the Lord's hand of blessing on my life.

I met Paul Roussel before my release and He shared how CAM could help me. After I was released from prison I started doing Bible studies with Paul, which helped to strengthen and build my faith.

It seems all are addicted to something; that something is usually our self. I'm not belittling the physical addictions many struggle with: alcohol, heroin, and other drugs. The root cause of addiction is self, and self pleasure. Christ call us to be selfless – not selfish, and that's the battle; as long as we are self-seeking, satan does not need to do anything - we will destroy ourselves.

After many weeks of frank discussions of God's word, Christ became important to these men in jail, and they began to change. Their selfish nature was slowly eroded and replaced with Christ's love. Others noticed the changes and soon the group grew and new believers were added. A mini revival of sorts. It is gratifying to see these Christians boldly sharing Jesus with other inmates. God can, and does, use each of our lives to share Jesus with others.

We must put on God's love, mend a quarrel, remove bitterness, replace suspicion with trust, keep our promises, express thanks, and pray for our enemies. Ask God to help you to love the way Jesus did, and still does.
